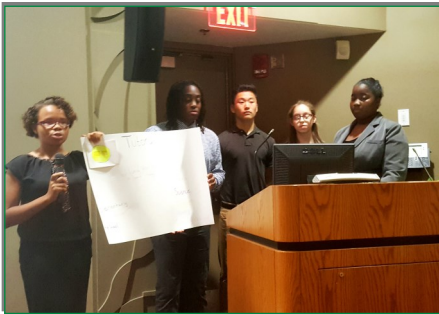

# BUILD A Successful Future

## Program

Project BUILD (**B**usiness **U**nited in **L**eadership **D**evelopment) is a four-week summer program designed for high school juniors and seniors. This mini-MBA program is held in partnership with the University of Louisville College of Business.



## Purpose

The primary objectives of Project BUILD are to:

- generate interest in the world of business among high school students
- encourage more students to study business in college
- motivate students to pursue careers in business-related fields.

## Admission

Students entering the 11th or 12th grade with a GPA of 2.5 or higher may apply. Students selected for the program should demonstrate leadership ability, creativity, curiosity, and enthusiasm for learning. Career interest in the field of business and/or management is recommended, but not required.

## Curriculum

Students are introduced to the world of business through collegiate level business courses, fieldtrips, and interaction with corporations, executives, and entrepreneurs. Courses of study include:

- Accounting
- Computer information Systems
- Economics
- Entrepreneurship
- Finance
- Insurance & Risk Management
- Management
- Marketing
- Statistics.



Students are actively engaged in business research, case study analysis and group presentations/demonstrations of learning.

Field trips to area businesses provide students with networking opportunities and are part of the program's collaborative nature. Business ethics and leadership are woven throughout the curriculum.

Professors and volunteers provide countless hours of service in a variety of ways. This additional support helps ensure the program remains free of charge for all participants.

## History

Project BUILD was established in 1986 by Lincoln Foundation in partnership with BATUS Inc., Brown-Forman, GE, National City Bank and University of Louisville College of Business.
